1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM for the approval of (a) the granting to the Directors of the Issue Mandate; (b) the granting to the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate; (c) the extension of the Issue Mandate by adding to it the aggregate number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate; (d) the re-appointment of auditor; and (e) the re-election of Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM held on 28 June 2019, the Shareholders passed an ordinary resolution to grant a general mandate to the Directors to repurchase shares of the Company not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at 28 June 2019. Such general mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM.

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will also be proposed to grant to the Directors the General Mandates. Conditional upon the above resolutions being passed, a separate resolution will be proposed to extend the Issue Mandate by adding to it the aggregate number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate. Details of these resolutions are contained in the AGM Notice.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 61,543,075 Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued share capital of the Company during the period between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued pursuant to the Issue Mandate on the date of passing the resolution approving the Issue Mandate will be 12,308,615 Shares and the maximum number of Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate on the date of the AGM will be 6,154,307 Shares.

In accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement as required by the Listing Rules in connection with the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of seven Directors, namely Mr. Meng Guang Bao, Ms. Zhang Ye, Ms. Huang Xiumei, Ms. Bao Limin, Mr. Zheng Bailin, Mr. Shen Ruolei and Mr. Pun Chi Ping.

Pursuant to paragraph 86(2) of the Bye-laws, any Director appointed by the Board to fill the casual vacancy on the Board shall hold office until the next following general meeting of the Company. Accordingly, Ms. Huang Xiumei and Ms. Bao Limin will hold office until the AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election of the AGM.

Pursuant to paragraph 87(1) of the Bye-laws, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time-being shall retire from office by rotation, provided that every Director (including those appointed for a specified term) shall be subject to retirement at least once every three years. Accordingly, Ms. Zhang Ye, Mr. Zheng Bailin and Mr. Pun Chi Ping (“**Mr. Pun**”) will retire by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

By virtue of A.4.3 of the Code on Corporate Governance Practices contained in Appendix 14 of the Listing Rules, serving more than 9 years could be relevant to the determination of a non-executive director's independence. As such, further appointment of Mr. Pun Chi Ping, who has served the Board for more than 9 years, is subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders.

The Nomination Committee of the Company has paid particular attention in assessing the independence of Mr. Pun Chi Ping, who has served on the Board for more than nine years. As Mr. Pun is not involved in the daily management of the Company, nor is he in any relationships or circumstance which would interfere with the exercise of his independent judgement, the Board considered that Mr. Pun Chi Ping has satisfied the requirements of independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules, his long service on the Board would not affect his integrity in exercising impartial and independent judgement on Board matters and his rich experience and professional knowledge can continue to bring valuable contribution to the Board and the growth of the Company.

Details of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

SHINEWING (HK) CPA Limited will retire as the Company's auditor and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-appointment of the AGM.

5. VOTING AT THE AGM

For the purpose of compliance with Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, the Company will procure the chairman of the AGM to demand for a poll for the ordinary resolutions put to the vote at the AGM in accordance with the Bye-laws. Each Shareholder who has the right to attend and vote at the AGM is entitled to appoint one or more proxies, whether they are Shareholders or not, to attend and vote at the AGM on his behalf.

The results of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the general meeting in which the poll was demanded or required and the poll results will be published on the websites of the Stock Exchange (<http://www.hkexnews.hk>) and the Company (<http://www.huajunintlgroup.com>).

6. ACTION TO BE TAKEN

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to Shareholders to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the granting of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 61,543,075 Shares. Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased from the Latest Practicable Date up to the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 6,154,307 Shares, representing 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of the AGM.

2. SOURCE OF FUNDS

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for the purpose and in accordance with the Company's constitutive documents and the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Company is incorporated or otherwise established. Bermuda laws provide that funds used for a share repurchase may only be paid out of the capital paid up on the relevant shares, or the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution, or the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for the purpose. The amount of premium, if any, payable on a repurchase may only be paid out of either the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company before the Shares are repurchased.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to seek a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions, and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. IMPACT OF REPURCHASES

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 31 December 2019, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company have been made up) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital of the Company or its gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If, on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code for all the Shares not already owned by such Shareholder or group of Shareholders.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, CHG, the controlling Shareholder, was interested in 44,450,619 Shares, representing approximately 72.23% of the total issued share capital of the Company. CHG was beneficially owned by Huajun Group Limited. Huajun Group Limited was wholly owned by Mr. Meng. Mr. Meng was deemed to be interested in all Shares held by CHG by virtue of the SFO. On the basis that the issued share capital of the Company and the shareholding of CHG and Mr. Meng personally in the Company remain unchanged immediately before the full exercise of the Repurchase Mandate, in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares in accordance with the terms of the relevant ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM, the interests of Mr. Meng in

the issued Shares would be increased to approximately 81.70% of the total issued share capital of the Company. The Directors are not aware of any consequences, which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases to be made under the Repurchase Mandate.

7. DIRECTORS, THEIR ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

To the best of the knowledge of the Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

8. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

9. REPURCHASES OF SHARES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not repurchased any Shares whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise, in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

10. GENERAL

The Listing Rules prohibit a company from making repurchase on the Stock Exchange if the result of the repurchase would be that less than 25% (or such other prescribed minimum percentage as determined by the Stock Exchange) of the company's issued share capital would be in public hands. The Directors do not intend to repurchase Shares which would result in less than the prescribed minimum percentage of Shares in public hands.

Ms. Huang Xiumei, *Executive Director*

Ms. Huang Xiumei (“**Ms. Huang**”), aged 42, has been appointed as an Executive Director of the Company on 27 February 2020, she is a practicing lawyer in the PRC. Ms. Huang has around 20 years of experience in legal industry and over 10 years of experience in corporate administration, investment and risk management. She is practicing and being a partner in 遼寧華君律師事務所 (Liaoning Huajun Law Firm). She joined the Company as the Vice President of Legal & Compliance department in June 2016 and is the legal representative of certain subsidiaries of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Ms. Huang has not held any other directorships in other public companies in the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas for the last three years.
